SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), Office of Research and Development, Technology Transfer Program, intends to grant to Microlight3D, 5 avenue du Grand Sablon, 38700 La Tronche, France, an exclusive license to U.S. Patent 9,778,573 (entitled "Optical Illumination System") issued October 3, 2017, and U.S. Patent 10,474,035 (entitled "Optical Illumination System") issued on November 12, 2019, and any related patent applications associated with VA Invention Disclosure number 13-093 titled "Tandem DMD-digital Holographic Illumination System".

The prospective exclusive license may be granted unless, within 15 days from the date of this published Notice, the Department of Veterans Affairs, Office of Research and Development, Technology Transfer Program receives written evidence and argument which establishes that the grant of the license would not be consistent with the requirements of 35 U.S.C. 209 and 37 CFR 404.7.
